

Year 10 Curriculum:

Our Y10 curriculum provides students with 3 distinct pathways over a 25 period week.

THE BLUE PATHWAY - (ENGLISH BACCALAUREATE)

This pathway is for those academically strong students who have the capability to achieve the full English Baccalaureate, i.e. the ability to gain a GCSE grade 4 or above in English Language, Mathematics, Double Science, a Modern Language and either Geography or History. This route encompasses the following aspects:

THE ORANGE PATHWAY - OPTIONAL ENGLISH BACCALAUREATE

This pathway is for those students who have the ability to make good progress over KS4 in a range of subjects. It gives students the opportunity to study for the English Baccalaureate, i.e. to gain a GCSE C grade or above in English Language, Mathematics, Double Science, a Modern Language and either Geography or History. This route encompasses the following aspects:

* It is expected that all students on the Orange Pathway will take at least one of the following subjects:

- History
- Geography
- French
- German
- Computer Science
- Triple Science

Please remember that to achieve the full English Baccalaureate, students will have to take either French or German **and** either Geography or History.

THE YELLOW PATHWAY

This route is for those students who would benefit from being able to select up to three high-quality vocational qualifications in addition to the core GCSE curriculum. This pathway will be particularly suitable for students who prefer continuous assessment and project-based work rather than end of course exams.
