07 AWARDED RESULTS SUMMARY

07a KS4 Awarded Results

NC presented the KS4 awarded results. Results have been analysed using the data management system, SISRA. Further analysis will take place following centre review outcomes. At the time of this meeting, no national comparison data was available

- There were 152 students in the 2021 KS4 cohort, 79 girls and 73 boys. Of these, 48 were DA, 2 SEN and 1 LAC. This is the first cohort to be measured on the new KS2
- High Ability cohort of 62: A8 6.11, P8 0.31
- Middle Ability cohort of 75: A8 4.49, P8 0.33
- Lower Ability cohort of 11: A8 2.61, P8 0.01
- SEND cohort of 23: A8 3.21, P8 -0.49
- EHCP cohort of 2: A8 4.20, P8 0.47
- Gap between DA & non-DA has reduced
- English Language & Literature and Maths continue to perform above the national average
- Successful subjects include Music, German, Photography, French and Computing at GCSE
- 2 vocational subjects Health & Social Care and Business performing well
- Sport Cam Nat has an SPI (School Performance Index) of -0.20. Geography, Sport & Food are to be monitored to ensure assessment is accurate and negative progress is swiftly identified and necessary interventions put in place
- Priorities for 2021/2022 leadership development include rigorous and accurate assessment, regular tracking to identify individuals who are not making the expected progress, first and second wave interventions, narrowing of gaps between DA and non-DA, a positive P8 for all groups and all Post 16 to have a positive VA
- Boys seem to have been more affected by the lockdown than girls. Attitude to learning has dipped amongst the boys with lower numbers logging on to online lessons and engaging with the work

NC: First wave is to look at what is happening in the classroom and the second wave is more external, getting them into P6 and holiday lessons

Q: (AB) In the event of another lockdown, would the students be happy to go back online?

NC: I wouldn't say happy as they are loving being back in the classroom but we are more prepared

Q: (JD) With the students now back in the classroom, do you expect to see an improvement with boys?

NC: Theoretically, yes

C: (LW) It's important to note that all this data is used for the CAG process

Q: (JD) What are the main actions that have led to improvement?

NC: Tutor groups for the most part. Additional funding has also allowed us to bring in more help

Q: (JD) Are you confident these actions will continue to improve things?

NC: Yes. We are looking at strategies lower down in the school and also looking towards more pastoral care

C: (LW) We have also held career interviews with Yr8s to raise aspirations

C: (LW) Lost learning due to lockdown has greatly impacted on DA students. ASCL report it will take 500 years, or 25 generations, to catch-up. The task is enormous but we must carry on. Extra time may not increase grades but it may raise aspirations. This pandemic didn't just impact on Yr10 going into Yr11, it affected every corner of the school

Q: (JM) Staff offered predicted grades – how accurate were they against final outcomes? NC: When they came back after lockdown, we collected the data on how they did during lockdown and formed intervention plans from there...

C: (LW) ...and if any grades looked inflated we asked to see the evidence. We had a very vigorous process. When normal exams resume, grades will be measured against 2019 and if there are any huge drops or inflations, questions will be asked

C: (NC) We have lots of strategies in place, we now just have to decide which ones to take forward

07b KS5 Awarded Results

PW presented the KS5 awarded results. VA (Value Added) has been calculated from GCSE results. This cohort has shown great resilience and overcome many hurdles with no student disadvantaged.

The cohort had an average APS of 6.14 and was made up as follows:

2020/2021 development priorities included delivering outstanding outcomes for all 6^{th} form students

- Level 3 Value Added scores were above average with DA coming out in line with non-DA
- 100% of those resitting English and/or Maths attained a Grade 4 or 5
- 100% of Yr13 have accessed appropriate post-18 destinations
- No students left as NEETs
- Of the 57 students, 40% achieved A*A, 60% achieved A*B making a 100% academic pass rate
- Average Grade of B was achieved, Progress figure of +0.41
- 93% of students retained
- There were 25 students studying towards a vocational qualification. 66% of these achieved a D* D and 100% achieved D* M
- Strong performances in BTEC Business, BTEC Media and V-Cert Engineering
- The pass rate for academics over the last 3 years has continued to climb whilst vocational D* -M has remained the same with a slight drop at D* -D

Overall VA for 2021: A Level +0.41, Applied General +0.68. National VA is 0.

Q: (JD) Have the vocational students found online learning more difficult?

PW: Personally, I think it has been a little easier. We have set coursework and they have been able to get on with it uninterrupted

C: (NC) The practical subjects are much more difficult to keep up online

Q: (AB) Have they all been Cottingham taught subjects?

PW: The majority were, yes

Successful subjects include

- English Literature
- English Language & Lit
- Biology
- Chemistry
- BTEC Media
- Classics
- BTEC Science
- Politics
- German

DA out-performed non-DA Applied General (+0.88 VA). Students with SEND out-performed their non-SEND counterparts (+1.14 VA), SEND A-Level (+1.17) and SEND Applied General; (+1.13) and Value Added remains above national average

Areas of concern are Art & Photography

C: (JM) There is a big problem when Art is taught as a combined class. We need to look at this as you can't teach Years 12 & 13 as one group, they are all at different levels. This wasn't the case for all the other subjects

C: (PW) We now have access to the other 6th Forms so we can effectively monitor what's going on in the classroom

C: (PW) 100% got into their first-choice university

Q: (JD) What about apprenticeships?

PW: We have 2 going to an accounting firm in Reading, 1 to McLaren F1, 1 to BEAL Homes and a few going to BAE. Apologies, I can't remember the total.

Q: (JD) Did the students find these themselves or did the school help?

PW: Danny Clinton does a lot of work with apprenticeships; from inviting speakers to come to school, using Unifrog and promoting the links on the Government website. Over the years we have put a lot more support into apprenticeships

Q: (AB) Did all that applied to an apprenticeship get into one?

PW: Yes, but some are backdated to start in October

Q: (JD) Are you working in partnership with the Consortium?

PW: Yes, the Apprenticeship Manger looks after things

Q: (AB) Are apprenticeships discussed at Year 11?

PW: Yes, we look at their ability and set them on the correct pathway


- C: (JD) That information needs to filter down from the 6th Form LGB
- Q: (DE) How do you calculate VA for students who didn't do the subject at GCSE?

PW: It's based on their average points score at GCSE, then we look at how those students normally perform in that subject and then it's up to us to make sure we are giving students aspirational targets with a positive value added

- C: (PW) Level 2 didn't achieve the Government Benchmark
- C: (NC) A lot of evidence was needed for their 2021 CAGs
- C: (PW) Year 13 2022 will be the first group to sit A Levels without sitting GCSE's. We will have to find the balance and assess them without causing undue stress
- C: (PW) The forecast for this year is slightly down
- Q: (DE) What do you think attributed to the rise in numbers to Year 12?
- C: (PW) Last year we had 5 students return from Wyke College, 1 from St Mary's and we put that down to the students feeling more supported and having a strong relationship with them
- C; (AB) Having a 6th Form on the same site is an advantage
- Q: (JD) Do you promote the 6th Form as one brand across the 3 sites?
- PW: We are working more collaboratively with Hessle and Wolfreton
- C: (AB) Thank you, Paul. It's been very valuable getting a first-hand account of 6th Form

Year 12 Recruitment Update

- 65 students enrolled into 6th Form (target 60)
- 151 students in Year 11 43% of the year group
- 75% of the top 20 achievers stayed on to study at CHS6th (average grade 7.00 or above)
- 66% of the top 50 achievers stayed on (average grade of 5.63 or above)
- High Ability cohort with an average GCSE grade of 6.0
