We offer over 30 course options and our combination possibilities mean that there is something for everyone.

SUPPORT

The change from school to sixth form is exciting but it is also very different. We make sure that you are supported through this period and throughout your time with us. We have highly qualified and experienced subject teachers who will support and guide you in your studies. Your Student Services Manager will help you settle in and will be a vital point of contact for advice and information. Subject to meeting eligibility criteria, there is also financial support available through the 16-19 Bursary Fund.

SUCCESS

In 2018 our A Level pass rate was 99%, with 45% of students achieving A* - B grades and 18% A* - A grades. A large proportion of our students successfully progress to university while others follow their career path through further education, employment and apprenticeships.

The BTEC National Extended Certificate in Business enables you to develop a range of skills and techniques essential for successful performance in working life. These include time management, problem solving, research and investigation and decision making.

The course is equivalent to one A Level.

This course can provide you with a springboard to a university degree, higher BTEC qualifications or employment.

- Strategic Methods: How to Pursue Strategies
- Managing Strategic Change

This course covers topics and issues that are relevant in today's society enabling you to study key contemporary developments such as digital technology, business ethics and globalisation.

ASSESSMENT:

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

The course will provide you with an excellent base on which to progress to university. It provides a critical understanding of business; knowledge for you to take into your chosen career.

COMPUTER SCIENCE (AQA)

Available at: Hessle Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

This course has been created to get students working with real-world programming and provides a good understanding of the fundamental principles of computing. The topics studied include:

- Programming
- Algorithms
- Computer Systems

- Data Structures
- Theory of Computation
- Computer Organisation and Architecture

You will also complete a computing practical project.

ASSESSMENT:



80% Exam20% Practical Project

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

The course will equip you very well for entry into Higher Education or the work place. Future careers could include games developer, systems analyst and web designer.

YOU WILL STUDY:

The Cambridge Technical Introductory Diploma in ICT has been developed to meet the changing needs of the sector. The course offers a more in-depth look at ICT in the workplace, and gives you an insight into its role in specialist careers. It has been designed in collaboration with experts spanning the breadth of the sector and focuses on the skills, knowledge and understanding that today's universities and employers demand. You will study the following:

- Fundamentals in IT
- Web Design and Prototyping
- Global Information

One additional unit is also studied.

ASSESSMENT:

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

The course will equip you very well for entry into Higher Education to study ICT, software or engineering.

YOU WILL STUDY:

A Level Art is for students who have a genuine interest in the subject. The course builds on your skills, knowledge and understanding gained at GCSE Level. During your studies you will:

- Record information, observations, ideas and insights in a wide range of visual forms
- Analyse and evaluate images, objects, artefacts and texts
- Develop sustained investigations and explore a range of visual materials, processes and resources
- Present articulate, personal, coherent and informed visual responses

You will also complete a personal investigation that includes a portfolio of practical work and a related study (minimum 1000 words) and also an externally set task.

ASSESSMENT:



100% Internal Assessment

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

Studying this subject is the natural route if you wish to embark on a career or degree opportunity in the Visual Arts or related sectors.

DRAMA AND THEATRE STUDIES (AQA)

Available at: Cottingham / Wolfreton Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

Drama and Theatre

- Creating Original Drama
- Making Theatre

You will explore the structural elements of theatre from the page to the stage through practical drama workshops and rehearsal practices. In addition there are plenty of creative activities open to you including annual plays, showcase evenings and music theatre shows.

ASSESSMENT:



- 60% Practical40% Exam
- **FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:**

Many students go on to study the subject at a higher level and progress to working in theatre, television, film and video. It could also be invaluable if you wish to become a journalist, teacher or lawyer.

MUSIC TECHNOLOGY

(Edexcel)

Available at: Wolfreton Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

You will complete four tasks which together make up this qualification. These are:

- Recording 3 to 3.5 minute assessment
- Technology Based Composition 3 minute assessment
- Listening and Analysing written exam 1.5 hours
- Producing and Analysing written/practical exam 2.25 hours

You are required to study the development of popular music. The course is not intended to be a comprehensive and in-depth study of every popular, jazz or rock music style, but an overview of the main styles and trends during the development of popular music.

ASSESSMENT:



- 60% Exam
- 40% Controlled Assessment

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

This qualification has been widely accepted by Higher Education and will provide valuable experience and preparation for students aiming to continue with their studies in the subject.

YOU WILL STUDY:

This A Level course will give you a rounded exposure to the different aspects of digital photography, allowing you to produce personalised work and display your abilities in a variety of disciplines.

- Personal Investigation You will produce two elements:
 A portfolio of practical work starting from a brief or scenario
 A related study (minimum 1000 words)
- Externally Set Task An extended response:
 You will be given a number of themes, each with a range of written and visual starting points, briefs and stimuli

ASSESSMENT:



100% Internal Assessment

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

Photography would be ideal if you wish to embark on a career or degree opportunity in the Visual Arts or related sectors. It is also ideally suited to students who have an interest in media.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE (OCR)

Available at: Hessle and Wolfreton Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

- Exploring Language Language under the microscope. Writing about a topical language issue. Comparing and contrasting texts
- **Dimensions of Linguistic Variation -** Child language acquisition. Language in the media. Language change
- Independent Language Research (coursework) Investigation 2000 to 2500 words, Academic poster 750 to 1000 words

This course looks at English in its various forms and contexts. It develops a variety of skills including critical reading, data analysis, evaluation and the ability to develop and sustain arguments.

ASSESSMENT:




FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

YOU WILL STUDY:

You will read and study a wide range of literature throughout the course, focussing on the writer's craft and style. You will recreate a literature text for a new audience and purpose using the skills you have learnt. Over the two years the following texts will be studied:

- The Kite Runner Khaled Hosseini
- The Lovely Bones Alice Sebold
- A Selection of Poetry Seamus Heaney
- Othello William Shakespeare
- All My Sons Arthur Miller

ASSESSMENT:



FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

This course is widely respected by universities and employers.





YOU WILL STUDY:

- Aspects of Tragedy Study of three texts: one Shakespeare text; a second drama text and one further text, of which one must be written pre-1900
- Elements of Crime or Political Writing Study of three texts: one post-2000 prose text; one poetry and one further text, of which one must be written pre-1900
- Theory and Independence (coursework) Study of two texts: one poetry and one prose
 text, informed by study of the critical anthology

You will have an in depth study of carefully selected texts that will provide you with a reading list for life, promoting the beauty of our language and the variety of its effects.

Many students go on to pursue the subject further at university.

MEDIA PRODUCTION

(BTEC - Edexcel)

Available at: Cottingham Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

- Media Representations
- Responding to a Commission
- Pre Production Portfolio
- Film Production (Fiction)

This BTEC National Extended Certificate is equivalent to one A Level. You will gain an understanding of how media products are constructed to create meaning through theory, the technical skills and techniques used to construct film products, and learn how to analyse media texts. You will also practice practical film based techniques such as pre-production planning and construction skills including project management, camera work, and editing techniques.

ASSESSMENT:



58% Exam/Set Task42% Coursework

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

You could progress to university or gain employment. Careers could include film director, producer or camera operator.

CLASSICAL CIVILISATION (OCR)

Available at: Hessle Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

- Component 1: The World of the Hero Homer's Iliad or Odyssey, Virgil's Aerneid
- Component 2: Culture and the Arts Greek Theatre
- Component 3: Beliefs and Ideas Love and Relationships

This course has been designed to provide students with a broad, coherent and rewarding study of the literature and culture of the classical world. It involves the study of the works of major Greek and Roman authors in English translation.



- Coastal Systems
- Global Systems and Governance
- Changing Places

- Water and Carbon Cycles
- Contemporary Urban Environments

You will explore physical and human geography and contemporary geographical issues. You will also develop your skills in fieldwork techniques, data analysis and interpretation.

Fieldwork is a vital component of the course and you will visit different locations depending on your place of study.

ASSESSMENT:



FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

Geography is very well respected by employers and educational establishments. It gives you numerical and literacy skills and shows you are able to work independently. Careers include environmental science, town planning, engineering, tourism and business.

HISTORY (AQA)

Available at: Cottingham, Hessle and Wolfreton Sixth Form YOU WILL STUDY:

- The Tudors: England, 1485-1603 Consolidation of the Tudor Dynasty: England, 1485-1547 England: Turmoil and Triumph, 1547-1603
- Democracy and Nazism: Germany, 1918-1945
 The Weimar Republic, 1918-1933
 Nazi Germany, 1933-1945
- Historical Investigation (coursework) 3000-3500 words

You will develop your skills in dealing with problems of bias and prejudice; identify reasons why particular events happen and understand the role of individuals in shaping these events.

ASSESSMENT:



- 80% Exam
- 20% Coursework

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

History is a well respected and a highly valued subject at A Level. Careers could include teaching, law, research, tourism, management and public administration.

Law is everywhere around us. It shapes the way our society works and in turn is itself shaped by the way society develops. On this course the following areas are studied:

- The Legal System
- Law Making
- The Nature of Law

- Criminal Law
- The Law of Tort
- Human Rights Law

You will examine the way laws are made, the criminal and civil court systems and the ways in which these courts interpret the law. Through your studies you will develop your analytical, problem solving, research and communication skills.

You could go on to complete a law degree and pursue a career as a legal executive, solicitor or barrister. However, the skills and knowledge learnt are also relevant for a wide range of other degree courses and professions.

Comparative Politics

Political Ideas

This course has been designed to actively encourage and develop an interest in the study of politics. It enables you to gain an insight into political beliefs and provides the tools to develop your skills of analysis and evaluation.

If you enjoy discussion and are interested in current affairs then this course will appeal to you.

ASSESSMENT:



100% Exam

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

Politics is a highly regarded academic qualification and can be used to enter a huge variety of university courses and careers such as law, journalism, criminology or politics itself.

SOCIOLOGY (AQA)

Available at: Hessle Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

You will be introduced to the key concepts and core themes surrounding sociology. The course aims to encourage your development and participation by engaging in contemporary issues, raising your sociological awareness and understanding.

The central focus of study is UK society today. You will conduct research and explore sociological theories, perspectives and methods surrounding the core themes of socialism, culture and identity, power and stratification and social differentiation.

The course components are:

- Education with Theory and Methods
- Topics in Sociology (Families and Households / Stratification and Differentiation)
- Crime and Deviance with Theory and Methods

ASSESSMENT:



100% Exam

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

A Level Sociology provides the opportunity to develop strong written and oral skills, as well as the capacity to think logically, creatively and coherently. This is useful in many career areas.


FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

This course extends the ideas found in A Level Mathematics, but it also opens up many new and more sophisticated areas of study such as complex numbers, in preparation for university.

FRENCH (AQA)

Available at: Cottingham / Wolfreton Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

- Social Issues and Trends
- Grammar
- Individual Research Project
- Political and Artistic Culture
- Works: Literacy Texts and Films

A Level French is designed to build on your knowledge and skills acquired at GCSE Level. The areas studied will stimulate your interest and will enable you to learn more about French culture. You will also develop your communication, critical thinking and research skills.

ASSESSMENT:



70% Listening, Reading and Writing30% Speaking

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

Competence in a foreign language is a very marketable qualification. Expert knowledge of foreign languages is in great demand both in the UK and abroad and yet less than 1% of the workforce in business possesses it.

Following on from your GCSE Level studies, these topics will broaden your depth of knowledge and also give you an insight into German culture. You will also develop your communication, critical thinking and research skills.

ASSESSMENT:



- 70% Listening, Reading and Writing
- 30% Speaking

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

Career paths entered by linguists include retail management, public relations, translating, banking, accountancy, social work, sales, marketing and teaching.

YOU WILL STUDY:

You will cover four themes. These are:

- Themes 1 and 3 Japanese society past and present
- Theme 2 Japanese artistic and intellectual culture past and present
- Theme 4 Japanese political culture past and present

Although Japanese speaking skills are not directly assessed in the qualification, students will be encouraged to develop these skills during their studies.

ASSESSMENT:



- 40% Translation into English, Reading Comprehension and Writing
- 30% Translation into Japanese and Written Response to Works
- 30% Listening, Reading and Writing

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

Studying Japanese will give you something a bit different to add to your CV or university application. Many students choose to progress to university to continue their language studies, either as a stand alone degree or combined with another subject.

SPANISH (AQA)

Available at: Wolfreton Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

- Social Issues and Trends
- Grammar
- Individual Research Project
- Political and Artistic Culture
- Works: Literacy Texts and Films

A Level Spanish is designed to build on your knowledge and skills acquired at GCSE Level. The areas studied will stimulate your interest and will enable you to learn more about Spanish culture. You will also develop your communication, critical thinking and research skills further.

ASSESSMENT:



70% Listening, Reading and Writing
30% Speaking

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

If you are intending to travel or use Spanish in your future career then this course is excellent preparation. You can progress to university or employment in the many sectors of business that require linguist skills, for example travel and tourism.

APPLIED SCIENCE

(BTEC - Edexcel)

Available at: Hessle Sixth Form

YOU WILL STUDY:

The BTEC National Extended Certificate in Applied Science provides a specialist work related qualification for the science sector and is equivalent to one A Level. You will develop your scientific practical skills and knowledge. The following units are studied:

- Principals and Application of Science I
- Practical Scientific Procedures and Techniques
- Science Investigation Skills

One additional unit is also studied.

ASSESSMENT:



58% Exam/Set Task42% Coursework

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES:

You could go straight into employment, for example, as a lab technician or progress onto a vocational, science based degree programme such as nursing or applied science.

- Organisms Respond to Changes In Their Internal and External Environments
- Genetic, Populations, Evolutions and Ecosystems
- The Control of Gene Expression




