Languages	All years; Tasks uploaded onto Microsoft Teams, emails are sent to notify students of the tasks. Students can also choose to use Memrise to strengthen their grammar knowledge	Email their teacher with the work attached
Maths	All years; www.hegartymaths.com	Logging in regularly, watching the videos and completing tasks. Teachers monitor performance on the tasks and praise, give feedback, set follow on tasks to consolidate or extend.
