## Curriculum

All students are entitled to an engaging, broad, balanced, rich, appropriately challenging and ambitious curriculum, with a strong academic core, delivered by specialists who are passionate about their subject.

Our aims are to provide an effective and enjoyable education where students achieve highly and are equipped with the knowledge and cultural capital, they need to be confident and succeed in life.

Our curriculum is designed sequentially so that new knowledge and skills build on what has been taught before through a mastery approach. This includes an emphasis on reading and vocabulary-rich programmes of study and a focus on careers education in each curriculum area, which will raise aspirations.

Above all, we want all our students to be enthusiastic about their studies and to instil in them a self-belief and an appetite for life-long learning.

## Teaching and Learning

Our curriculum is based upon the national curriculum which provides students with the essential knowledge that they need to be educated citizens, introducing them to the best that has been thought and said and helping to engender an appreciation of human creativity and achievement.

#### Key Stage 3 (Years 7, 8 and 9)

We teach Key Stage 3 (KS3) in Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9. Our students study the core subjects of:

- English
- Maths
- Science
- Computing
- PSHE/RSE
- Performing Arts (Art & Design, Drama and Music)
- The Humanities (History, Geography and Religious Education)
- Modern Foreign Languages (French or German)
- Physical Education
- Technology

#### Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11)

We offer a range of option choices to students at Key Stage 4 (KS4), in addition to GCSEs in the core subjects studied at KS3 and a variety of other qualifications including BTEC, OCR National and NCFE Vocational Certificate.

The vast majority of our students take a Double Award in Science with separate GCSEs in Biology, Chemistry and Physics available for students who select Triple Science as part of their options programme.











## School Life

#### Extracurricular

We offer a wide range of extracurricular activities to our students.

Our staff are very generous with their time in order to enrich students' experiences and a large number of clubs and activities are available, covering a wide variety of interests.

### Catering

The food at Cottingham is provided by abm Catering who serve great, fresh food using the very best of seasonal ingredients to create nutritious, innovative and exciting dishes.

#### Uniform
